# FROM THE PASTOR

This month we celebrate the 247th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence. On July 4, 1776, the Continental Congress declared the 13 British Colonies in America to be free and independent states.

That Declaration concluded "with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes and our sacred honor." And so, in a spirit of confidence in God, in their cause, and in one another, they declared their independence. And our nation was born.

The marks of that declaration, the ensuing independence, and its resulting establishment of a new nation are still important to us today. The United States flag, the Star Spangled Banner, and the bald eagle are symbols of the national truths we hold "to be self-evident" of our shared citizenship and our constitutional freedoms.

And we are marked by an extensive patriotism that always seems appropriate to us. Collectively, we do not want anything or anyone to interfere or challenge that sense of loyalty and pride. We are, occasionally, willing to acknowledge our imperfections yet we, one way or another, maintain our mark of the greatest nation on earth. These are, among others, the marks of the American citizen.

By the grace of God and the trustworthy Word of God -Holy Scripture-let me humbly proclaim thoughts on greater marks upon us all.

Many centuries earlier another devoted group also made an astonishing claim. They were a guileless group of fishermen, laborers, and ordinary folk, who followed a carpenter-teacher from Nazareth, named Jesus. They testified this Jesus, crucified, dead, and buried, had risen from the dead and was indeed the Son of God and Savior of the world. Accused by the temple leaders of spouting an absurd proclamation while also facing persecution and martyrdom, they boldly stood by their testimony, One of their spokesmen, a man named Paul, wrote to a fellowship of shared believers in Galatia these words:

"May I never boast of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world....From now on...I carry the marks of Jesus branded on my body." (Galatians 6:14, 17)

Never before and never since, even from an esteemed, historical Continental Congress, has there been a more impactful, declared word in the history of history. While waving the triad of colorful stripes and stars, we boast of a nation of freedom and choice and of a patriotic citizenship that asserts a global, historical impact.

God's word to Paul inspires him to boast of something simple, yet rugged and cruel. Why boast of a cross? It was a symbol of death and defeat. Jesus, who was nailed to that cross, had been greeted with scorn and mockery. And he was marked with thorns and nail wounds and a pierced side.

We bear the marks when we profess our allegiance and proclaim our right to the redeeming freedom His grace and love bestow to us. However, it is not an allegiance nor a right. It is a unmerited gift and we are marked by it. We are forever transformed by it.

After Jesus was crucified, the first community marked by His grace was formed. From those early witnesses, countless others came to faith. They, like us, were marked by the cross of Christ.

Paul's life was changed by the mark of the Living Lord and he found in the cross the power of God's love and forgiveness. It changed him completely, and he dedicated his life to the proclamation of that cross. When opposing voices saw Paul's as "idle boast" he declared, "I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith."

The transforming mark of the cross is seen in the changed lives of people who have met the Christ of the cross, and by His grace have submitted in repentance and faith.

The reason we, Baptists in particular, value the separation of church and state is not because we don't want all to come to faith in Jesus. It is because we DO want all to come to faith in Jesus.


